LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Vote on April 4th! Plenty of local measures, officials and school board members deserving of your opinion.

Some Key Bills being discussed and news to watch

- Special Road Districts—<u>HB 345</u>, sponsored by Representative Mike McGirl (R-Potosi). The bill removes the restriction that certain special road districts cannot expend more than one-fourth of the district's revenue within the district's corporate municipal boundaries.
- Solid Waste Disposal Permits—<u>HB 909</u>, sponsored by Representative Mike Haffner (R-Pleasant Hill). This measure relates to a proposed solid waste disposal site in southern Jackson County. The bill changes the permissible distance from an adjoining municipality from one-half mile to one mile and requires a public hearing to be held within 30 days of providing public notice.
- <u>HB1370</u>, which diverts the SB262 proceeds from the State Road Fund to a new special fund, has been determined as unconstitutional. HB 1370 violates Art. IV. Sec. 30(a) of the Missouri Constitution which directs that **all** motor fuel taxes be deposited into the State Road Fund.



2023 TALLO AWARD CALL FOR NOMINATIONS



The Vincent Tallo Service Award is presented by the Missouri Chapter APWA to employees of member organizations, municipalities, or firms who have completed thirty or more years of service to the public with a single organization, municipality or firm.

The Tallo Service Awards are named after Vince Tallo, who was a long time employee of Laclede Gas Company, and long time active member of the Missouri Chapter of APWA and strong supporter of public works. Vince worked at Laclede Gas from 1958 to 2001. In the 43 years he worked at Laclede, he held a number of positions through out his career including the position of Manager of Right of Way. In this position, Vince was the company's liaison with the 90 municipalities, City, County and State Officials and Highway Departments in the St. Louis Metropolitan area. He was the ultimate professional in his approach on everything he did and worked tirelessly in promoting fellowship with everybody he met.

Vince was an active member in the APWA for over 17 years. He first became a member in 1985 and became the St. Louis Branch Chairman in 1990, was the Missouri Chapter President in 1998 and remained active in the APWA up to his retirement. Vince passed away shortly after his retirement from Laclede in 2002.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Nominees must be employees of an APWA member organization, municipality, or firm.
- Nominee must have served for a minimum of 30 years with the same organization, municipality, or firm.
- The organization, municipality or firm must be a member of the Missouri Chapter at the time the nomination is made, but does not have to have been a member for the entire 30 year award period.

Selection Criteria:

30 years service with a single member organization, municipality, or firm.

Nomination Process:

 Organization, municipality, or firm must send letter nominating eligible employees stating employees name, current position, and term of service to the Chairman or to a member of the Chapter Awards Committee.

Deadline and Award Presentation:

Letters of nomination must be submitted no later than May 1, 2023.







APA: PROSPERITY THROUGH ZONING REFORM

More and more, US cities are recognizing the exclusionary and classist origins of their zoning ordinances and are realigning them to build more affordable, vibrant, equitable, and sustainable cities. This virtual event, moderated by M. Nolan Gray, author of "Arbitrary Lines: How Zoning Broke the American City and How To Fix It", will begin with a discussion on the problematic history of zoning laws, the harms and limitations they pose for effective planning in modern cities, and the case for radical reform. Planning leaders from Minneapolis, MN and Buffalo, NY, will then describe the significant reforms their cities have enacted in the last few years, which have already contributed to strides in housing opportunity in the case of Minneapolis, and reversing population decline in the case of Buffalo.

M. Nolan Gray, Research Director at California YIMBY

M. Nolan Gray is the research director for California YIMBY and an expert in urban land-use regulation. He is the author of Arbitrary Lines: How Zoning Broke the American City and How To Fix It. Gray previously worked as a planner in New York City, where he worked on the front lines of zoning. He is a widely published author, with work appearing in outlets such as The Atlantic, Bloomberg Citylab, and The Guardian. He lives in Los Angeles, California and is originally from Lexington, Kentucky.

Meg McMahan, Director of Planning, City of Minneapolis

Meg McMahan, AICP, is the Director of Planning for the City of Minneapolis, where she works to leverage development and regulatory systems to drive equitable outcomes. Prior to Minneapolis, Meg worked for the City of Brooklyn Center, MN as the Community Development Director where she led the department through a transitional time, which resulted in new ordinances, policies and approaches that were community-centered and met the needs of a diverse and dynamic citizenry. She received her Master's in Urban and Regional Planning from the Humphrey School of Public Affairs and her B.A. in Sociology from Hamline. When she isn't working she is most likely camping with her family along the North Shore of Lake Superior or the Boundary Waters Canoe Area in Northern Minnesota.

Chris Hawley, Senior Planner, City of Buffalo

Chris Hawley is a city planner in Buffalo, NY. Since 2009, he has worked in the Mayor's Office of Strategic Planning in Buffalo, NY, where he is focused on historic preservation and zoning reform. He was instrumental in the writing and adoption of Buffalo's Green Code, a city-wide form based code which went into effect in 2017 and was the recipient of the Form Based Codes Institute's Driehaus Award in 2019. Chris previously worked for US Senator Charles E. Schumer and Buffalo developer Howard Zemsky. He has a degree in Urban Design from New York University.
