Derek Koestel introduced this month's speaker, Christopher Parrish. Mr. Parrish is the Manager of Engineering overseeing the Lead Service Line Replacement Program for Missouri American Water Company. He has 18 years of engineering, operations, and production experience.

A revised Lead and Copper Rule will require utilities build an inventory of service lines by October 2024 and identify a plan to replace utility side service lines where an exceedance of lead levels exist. Missouri American Water's inventory will be over 500,000 homes. American Water, and by extension Missouri American Water Company, is going above and beyond current regulations and

replacing customer-side lead service lines at no direct cost to the customer. They have been replacing lead service lines since 2017 and have a goal as a company to replace all lead service lines by 2030.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Some Key Bills being discussed and news to watch

- On April 13, Governor Mike Parson announced the Department of Economic Development has awarded \$30 million through the Local Tourism Asset Development Grant Program for 26 projects: <https://ded2.mo.gov/media/pdf/local-tourism-asset-development-grant-program-recipients>.
- Missouri senate passes [\\$50 billion state budget](#). It includes \$2.8 billion to widen Interstate-70 to at least three lanes in both directions from Blue Springs near Kansas City to Wentzville near St. Louis. The budget outline goes back to the House with tweaks, where state Representatives are expected to move for budget negotiations between a committee of House and Senate members. The constitutional deadline to pass a balanced state budget is May 5.
- Construction of Earthen Basins - The House debated [HB 1207](#), sponsored by Representative Bennie Cook (R-Houston). The bill seeks to fix an unintended consequence of a 2015 law that established the term “earth and basin”. During committee discussion, substitute language was adopted to align the bill with the Senate companion, [SB 266](#),
- Solid Waste Management—The House General Laws Committee considered passage of [HB 93](#), sponsored by Representative Adam Schwadron (R-St Charles). Currently, facilities designed to incinerate solid waste must provide a health and safety buffer of at least 50 feet from a facility located in a nonresidential area in St. Louis City and at least 300 feet from a facility anywhere else in the state. After no discussion, the committee passed the bill by a 10-5 vote.

2023 TALLO AWARDS



The Vincent Tallo Service Award is presented by the Missouri Chapter APWA to employees of member organizations, municipalities, or firms who have completed thirty or more years of service to the public with a single organization, municipality or firm.

The Tallo Service Awards are named after Vince Tallo, who was a long time employee of Laclede Gas Company, and long time active member of the Missouri Chapter of APWA and strong supporter of public works. Vince worked at Laclede Gas from 1958 to 2001. In the 43 years he worked at Laclede, he held a number of positions through out his career including the position of Manager of Right of Way. In this position, Vince was the company's liaison with the 90 municipalities, City, County and State Officials and Highway Departments in the St. Louis Metropolitan area. He was the ultimate professional in his approach on everything he did and worked tirelessly in promoting fellowship with everybody he met.

Vince was an active member in the APWA for over 17 years. He first became a member in 1985 and became the St. Louis Branch Chairman in 1990, was the Missouri Chapter President in 1998 and remained active in the APWA up to his retirement. Vince passed away shortly after his retirement from Laclede in 2002.

More and more, US cities are recognizing the exclusionary and classist origins of their zoning ordinances and are re-aligning them to build more affordable, vibrant, equitable, and sustainable cities. This virtual event, moderated by M. Nolan Gray, author of “Arbitrary Lines: How Zoning Broke the American City and How To Fix It”, will begin with a discussion on the problematic history of zoning laws, the harms and limitations they pose for effective planning in modern cities, and the case for radical reform. Planning leaders from Minneapolis, MN and Buffalo, NY, will then describe the significant reforms their cities have enacted in the last few years, which have already contributed to strides in housing opportunity in the case of Minneapolis, and reversing population decline in the case of Buffalo.

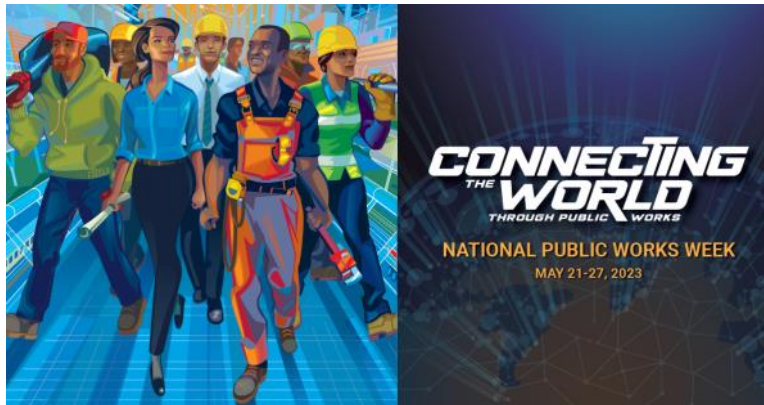
