


DEI UPDATE

Your DEI Committee has been busy behind the scenes. Several of us attended PWX 2023 in San Diego and wanted to share some of the information we learned.

APWA'S DEI Roadmap

This session was all about how the Committee for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion is integrating DEI at the National level.

The 5 dimensions of diversity were discussed and how they relate to an organization:



- Identity Personality
- Primary Age, Ethnicity, Gender Identity, Mental/ Physical Ability, Sexual Orientation, Gender, Race
- Secondary Religion, Working Style, Language/Accent, Communications Style, Geographic Location, Marital/ Relationship Status, Parental/Family Status, Appearance, Education
- Organizational Level, Network, Union Affiliation, Role in the Company, Division/Department, Work Experience, Management Status, Education, Industry, Tenure
- Cultural Time, Body Language, Traditions/
 Observances, Competition or Cooperation, Power and Authority Views, Conflict Resolution Preferences, Flexible or Structured, Personal Space, Individual or Teams, Being or Doing

Dimensions of diversity refers to the overall diversity of an organization and it's members who have different traits, backgrounds and abilities. It showed how we should consider the whole person and what they can bring to the organization and note just their qualifications or experience.

This session also discussed how the Committee for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion is driving DEI Individual Learning and Awareness across APWA. Their areas of focus are:

- Provide DEI education to APWA volunteers and Facilitate DEI education for APWA members.
- Diversify education and engagement opportunities.
- Provide DEI education and/or resources to managers at public works companies and agencies.
- Provide DEI education to APWA staff.

There was also an interactive portion of the session where questions were asked in order to gauge how members were currently embracing DEI, and what is desired for DEI within APWA in the future.






