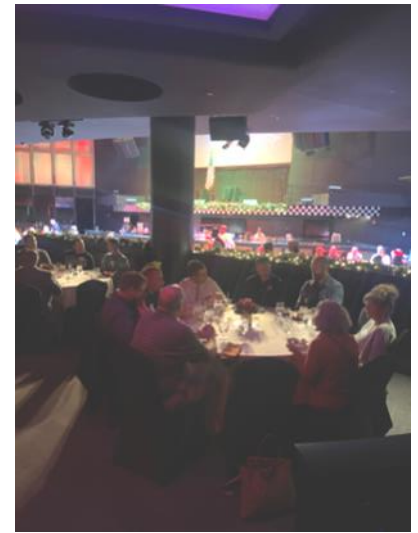

### 2023 LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Initial numbers: Over 800 bills filed in the House. Over 500 filed in the Senate.

#### Key notes on House and Senate Leadership

- Cindy O’Laughlin was elected as Senate Majority Floor Leader
- Caleb Rowden, Senate Pro Tem
- Dean Plocher – House Speaker
- Jon Patterson – Majority Floor Leader
- Jamie Burger – Asst Maj Floor Leader
- House has 49 freshman, Senate has 8 freshman.
- House demographics – 111 Republicans, 52 Democrats
- Senate demographics – 24 Republicans, 10 Democrats

#### Some Key Bills to Watch

- [SB 408](#) – EXCAVATION: Sponsor: Schroer - This act provides that all political subdivisions shall require an excavation permit to perform excavation work involving directional boring in any residential area. Such permits shall require certain conditions as provided in the act.
- [HB 480](#) -- HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITY PERMITS: Sponsor: Baker— Currently, a hazardous waste facility permit is not necessary for certain resources recovery facilities approved by the Department of Natural Resources. This bill removes this exemption.
- [SB 362](#)— Public notice requirements on public projects: Sponsor: Koenig— This act modifies the public notice requirements required for certain public contracts. Required to post an invitation for bid on its website or through some other electronic medium available to the general public and allow such invitation to be posted for a period of 10 days prior to bids being opened
- Governor Parson announced his [plan for I-70](#) at his annual State of the State address. Preliminarily: \$895 million, 19 miles in KC, 13 miles in Columbia, 20 miles in St. Louis.

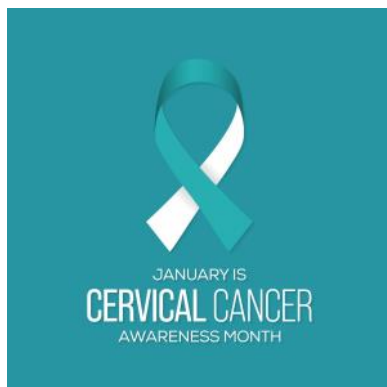
**Martin Luther King Day**
