

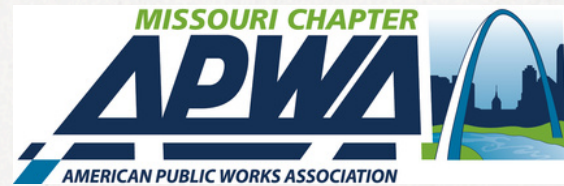

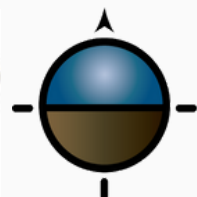

Thanks to all that played in and sponsored the golf tournament!



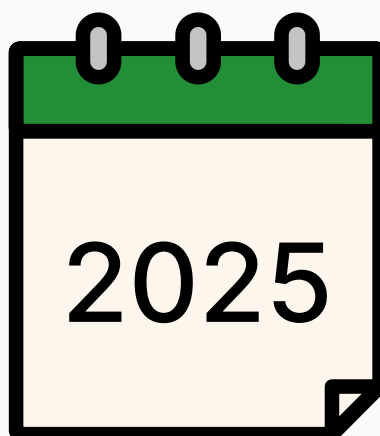

## WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH



### Recognizing the Role of Women in Public Works

March is National Women's History Month, a time dedicated to celebrating the contributions of women throughout history and across all sectors of society. One of the most impactful yet often overlooked areas where women have made significant strides is in public works. From civil engineering and infrastructure development to urban planning and transportation, women have played a crucial role in shaping the communities we live in today.

Historically, the field of public works was male-dominated, but over the years, women have broken barriers to become engineers, project managers, policymakers, and leaders in the industry. Women like Emily Warren Roebling, who oversaw the completion of the Brooklyn Bridge, and Ellen Swallow Richards, a pioneer in environmental engineering, paved the way for future generations.
