

The City of Des Peres is seeking an individual to serve as a Street Maintenance Worker. Under the supervision of the Street Superintendent and Street Foreman, this position performs skilled and semi-skilled manual work and equipment operation in maintaining city streets, sidewalks, street trees, public grounds and facilities.

Street Maintenance Workers are part of the Streets Division within the Department of Public Works. This team is responsible for performing a variety of tasks related to the maintenance and improvement of city trees, streets, sidewalks, bridges, and public rights-of-way. Works as part of a team to ensure safe and well-maintained public infrastructure, including seasonal operations like snow removal and storm clean-up.

Must possess a valid Missouri CDL Driver's license or the ability to obtain one within six months. Must be able to operate motorized equipment such as pickups, dump trucks, and skid-steers. Good driving record to be maintained during period of employment. Primary responsibilities will consist of physical/manual labor outdoors in varied weather conditions, performing tasks such as asphalt and concrete repair, snow removal, and forestry work. This position requires the ability to speak effectively and interact with the general public, and to communicate both oral and written instructions to work crews. The preferred candidate would have a minimum 3 years of experience in street maintenance and/or public works operations, but candidates with less experience will also be considered.
