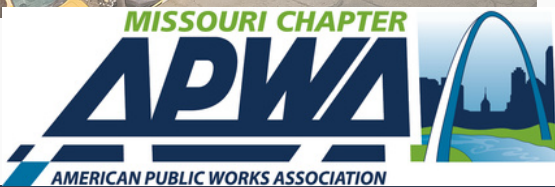

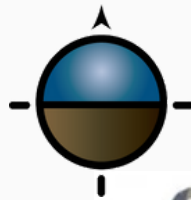

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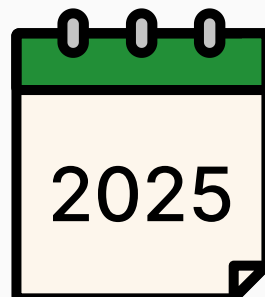

ABOUT OUR PROJECTS

KOMUCALA, BOLIVIA

THE KOMUCALA PROJECT STARTED WITH A SMALL FARMING COMMUNITY OF 27 HOMES. OUR CHAPTER ADOPTED THE PROJECT IN 2014 AND WAS ABLE TO HELP PROVIDE ACCESS TO 3 SPRINGS THAT PROVIDE WATER TO THE COMMUNITY. OVER THE YEARS OUR INVOLVEMENT HAS RESULTED IN MULTIPLE WATER SOURCES AND FLUSHING LATRINES THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY AND PUBLIC SPACES.

THE COMMUNITY'S WATER SOURCES ARE BEING IMPACTED BY THE RECENT DROUGHTS AROUND THE LAKE TITICACA AREA. THE GATEWAY PROFESSIONAL CHAPTER HAS RECRUITED THE HELP OF A GROUP OF SIUE STUDENTS WHO ARE WORKING ON RENEWING A CHAPTER AT THEIR SCHOOL. NEXT STEPS INCLUDE A REMOTE ASSESSMENT OF THE COMMUNITY TO IDENTIFY ANY DAMAGES AND GATHER DATA ON THE WATER SYSTEM.



EL VENTARRON, NICARAGUA

THE EL VENTARRON PROJECT BEGAN IN 2020 AND STARTED OFF SLOW DUE TO COVID 19. OVER THE COURSE OF THE PROJECT, THE GATEWAY PROFESSIONAL CHAPTER WAS ABLE TO FUND A SEISMO-ELECTRIC STUDY TO LOCATE TWO POTENTIAL WATER SOURCES. THE CHAPTER MADE AN ASSESSMENT TRIP IN DECEMBER OF 2023. DUE TO UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES, THE CHAPTER HAD TO CUT THE ASSESSMENT TRIP SHORT.
